PURPOSE

To seek Medi-Cal reimbursement for medical expenditures of non-adjudicated youth residing within the juvenile halls and Suitable Placement-Ordered Youths residing in Dorothy Kirby Center.

POLICY

The approved clinical care provided for non-adjudicated youth and youth who have Suitable Placement-Orders will be billed to Medi-Cal. The following youths are considered Medi-Cal eligible:

- 1. Youths in the juvenile halls who have not been adjudicated by the courts.
- 2. Youths in Dorothy Kirby Center who have Suitable Placement Orders.
- 3. Youths in a residential treatment camp who have returned from the camp back to the juvenile hall who have been seen by a physician, dentist, or optometrist.
- 4. Those youths removed from placement and brought back in the juvenile hall for various reasons, such as medical needs and failed placement awaiting new placement.

PROCEDURE

- 1. At each facility, Health Information Management (HIM) receives the Juvenile Court Custody List which will indicate which youths have been given Placement Orders.
- 2. Consolidated Business Office (CBO) staff will receive the list of youth given placement orders and will have access to PEMRS to coordinate the billing process for these youth.
- 3. Medical services provided to the youths will be billed to Medi-Cal, according to established CBO procedures.
