PURPOSE

To define JCHS policy regarding the availability and use of the health record for documentation by all health care professionals at each clinical encounter.

POLICY

JCHS Health Information Management (HIM) will maintain health service records within the Electronic Health Record on all youth in the Probation facilities. All the content, which include but is not limited to, procedures and education material has been approved by the Juvenile Court Health Services Medical Director.

Any juvenile custody information, including guardian information, may be included in the electronic health record (PEMRS). This information should only be relevant for clinical decisions and may include information such as history of violence, drug and alcohol use, mental condition at the time of arrest, possession of medication or details of the crime leading to arrest.

PROCEDURE

- 1. A health services record shall be maintained on each youth to provide documented evidence of the youth's physical condition, treatment, and medical care given.
- 2. The HIM Department shall make available health service records for approved case management planning, Quality Improvement (QI) audits, and sharing of information.
