<u>PURPOSE</u>

Establish a policy regarding the education of patients in order to promote optimal recovery and function, healthy behaviors, and to prevent and/or minimize injury, disease, and complications.

POLICY

Patient/guardian shall be offered information and education to meet their ongoing health care needs. Providers shall encourage patients and guardians to participate in health care and service decisions.

PROCEDURE

- The patient's health education needs, abilities, learning preferences, and readiness to learn shall be assessed and prioritized. The assessment shall include the following, as indicated: motivation to learn; physical and cognitive limitations; language comprehension barriers; and psychosocial, spiritual, and cultural practices.
- The caregiver shall be provided with instruction if the patient is not capable of understanding/ following instruction.
- Patient/guardian education shall:
 - Be interactive and flexible according to patient's/guardian's needs and responses
 - Be presented in terms that the patient/guardian can understand
 - Involve as many disciplines as necessary to achieve optimal outcomes
- Patient/guardian educational content shall include, as indicated:
 - Disease process and potential complications
 - Safe and effective use of medications, medical equipment, and supplies
 - Nutritional instruction and potential food-drug/herb-drug interactions
 - Habilitation or rehabilitation techniques
 - Pain and pain management
 - Available resources and how to obtain further care, services, or treatment
 - Patient and guardian responsibilities for ongoing health care
 - Patient safety

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- The effectiveness of patient/guardian education shall be evaluated. Patient education strategies shall be modified as applicable.
- The provider/licensed staff shall document inpatient patient/guardian education in the electronic health record (EHR) under patient education, located in the toolbar.
- The provider/licensed staff shall document ambulatory care/ED patient/guardian teaching in the EHR under patient education, located in the toolbar.
- Incidental and discipline-specific patient/guardian teaching will be documented in the notes tab in the EHR.
- Discharge instructions are provided to the patient/guardian and if any organization responsible for continuing health care.
