MODEL DEFINITION OF PHYSICAL THERAPY FOR STATE PRACTICE ACTS

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PURPOSE: To delineate the Physical Therapy Practice Act and Regulations of the

Physical Therapy Examining Committee.

POLICY: Physical Therapy is the care and services provided by or under the

direction and supervision of a physical therapist and includes but is not

limited to the following:

- 1. Examining and evaluating patients with impairments, functional limitations, and disability or other health-related conditions in order to determine a diagnosis, prognosis, and intervention; examinations include but are not limited to the following:
 - a. aerobic capacity or endurance
 - b. anthropometric characteristics
 - c. arousal, mentation, and cognition
 - d. assistive, adaptive, supportive and protective devices
 - e. community or work reintegration
 - f. cranial nerve integrity
 - g. environmental, home, or work barriers
 - h. ergonomics or body mechanics
 - i. gait and balance
 - j. integumentary integrity
 - k. joint integrity and mobility
 - I. motor function
 - m. muscle performance
 - n. neuromotor development and sensory integration
 - o. orthotic requirements
 - p. pain
 - q. posture
 - r. prosthetic requirements
 - s. range of motion
 - t. reflex integrity
 - u. self care and home management
 - v. sensory integrity
 - w. ventilation, respiration and circulation
 - x. physiological monitoring

- y. cardiac monitoring
- 2. Alleviating impairments and functional limitations by designing, implementing, and modifying therapeutic interventions that include, but are not limited to:
 - a. therapeutic exercise (including aerobic conditioning)
 - b. functional training in self care and home management (including activities of daily living and instrumental activities of daily living)
 - c. functioning training in community or work reintegration (including activities of daily living, work hardening, and work conditioning)
 - d. manual therapy techniques, including mobilization and manipulation
 - e. prescription, fabrication, and application of assistive, adaptive, supportive, and protective devices and equipment
 - f. airway clearance techniques
 - g. debridement and wound care
 - h. physical agents and mechanical modalities
 - i. electro-therapeutic modalities
 - j. patient-related instruction
 - k. wellness
