POLICY AND PROCEDURE

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PURPOSE:

Rancho Los Amigos National Rehabilitation Center excels in providing comprehensive rehabilitation care to severely disabled individuals of all ages. Therapy treatment areas, clinics, diagnostic laboratories and surgeries in this medical center are planned for the specialized care of patients with severe physical disabilities resulting from congenital causes, diseases or injury.

PHILOSOPHY:

We believe that the uniqueness of occupational therapy lies in the individualized analysis and adaptation of patients' daily activities which ranges from self-care to work and play, in the context in which they occur. In helping patients achieve functional goals which are vital to them, we believe that they have, not only the right, but the need to participate in making informed choices and in planning their program. Although we may use preventative, corrective and compensatory measures in treatment, our firm belief is that the true value of our service rests in the use of functional activities which have meaning to the individual because of their relevancy to his occupational roles, environment, and goals.
