SUBJECT: GASES FOR MEDICAL USE/MEDICAL GAS SYSTEM POLICY NO. 437B

### **PURPOSE**:

To provide availability of medical gases for patient care.

#### **POLICY:**

Facilities Management shall maintain gases for medical use at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center and component sites.

## **PROCEDURE:**

- Facilities Management shall order, receive, store inventory and keep records of all medical gases in bulk and cylinders.
- Facilities Management shall deliver medical gases to wards and other user areas in a safe and timely manner.
- Medical gases will be administered by qualified patient care providers only.
- Preventive maintenance will occur as required by regulatory agencies.
- Major valves and emergency shut-off controls shall be tagged.
- Installation or repairs shall be performed according to code.

## **Medical Gas Shut-Off**

- Only Clinical Staff, under the direction from a Respiratory Therapist, Nurse Manager, and/or Charge Nurse are authorized to shut off any medical gas valve.
- If it is necessary to shut off oxygen, ensure that all oxygen dependent patients have alternative means of life support including oxygen.
- Oxygen should only be shut off at the zone valve when:
  - 1. A fire is being fed by oxygen and is becoming large.
  - 2. The oxygen cannot be shut off at the bedside without endangerment of life.
  - 3. If an explosion occurs and it is followed by a fire, fire protocol shall be followed to ensure safety.

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- To shut off the Oxygen Zone Valve:
  - 1. Note the label above or inside the valve box which identifies the rooms that are controlled by that valve.
  - 2. Remove the valve box cover. Verify the correct valve to be secured.
  - 3. For those with flat handle valves, grasp handle and rotate ¼ turn; for those with round handle valves, turn handles clockwise until it stops.
  - 4. If gas shut off is successful by the Clinical Staff; Facilities Management shall be contacted to turn the valve on again. Be sure to identify which valves were turned off.
  - 5. In the event there is failure to shut off the gas outlet or supply medical gases, notify Facilities Management at Ext. 3301 from 7:00 am to 4:30 pm (Monday to Friday), and the hospital Operator at Ext. 2345 after normal working hours, weekends and holidays, to have the 24 hour maintenance personnel paged.
