

ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY AND PROCEDURE

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Subject: UNIFORM STATEWIDE EMERGENCY CALL CODE Policy No.: A415

PURPOSE:

To enhance the safety of workforce members, patients, and visitors across the enterprise by facilitating appropriate response to specific emergencies through code uniformity. Unanticipated circumstances that can be life-threatening or cause significant harm to workforce members, patients, and visitors requiring immediate attention. This policy applies to all patient care facilities in Department of Health Services.

POLICY:

The following standardized emergency codes shall be used for paging over the public address system and/or other appropriate means of communication at patient care facilities within the Department of Health Services:

- CODE ASSIST for urgent medical assistance to outpatients, visitors, and staff
- CODE BLUE for adult medical emergency
- CODE GOLD for mental health/behavioral response
- CODE GRAY for a combative person
- **CODE GREEN** for patient elopement
- CODE ORANGE for a hazardous material spill/release
- CODE PINK for infant abduction
- CODE PURPLE for child abduction
- CODE RAPID RESPONSE for urgent medical attention for inpatients
- CODE RED for fire
- CODE SILVER for a person with a weapon and/or active shooter and/or hostage situation
- CODE TRIAGE ALERT for potential disaster
- CODE TRIAGE EXTERNAL for external disaster
- CODE TRIAGE INTERNAL for internal disaster
- **CODE WHITE** for pediatric medical emergency
- **CODE YELLOW** for bomb threat

Note: Each patient care facility should establish its own response procedures related to the aforementioned standardized emergency codes. The use of a verbal modifier (during announcement) is allowed to enhanced communication and/or understanding, i.e. Code Pink with description of the infant – "Code Pink, female newborn with blue top."

Additional request for standardized codes shall be reviewed by the Health Services Enterprise Safety Officer Committee.
