PURPOSE

To provide guidelines for LASD in the enforcement of confiscating weapons from psychiatric patients.

POLICY

In circumstances where LASD is the primary investigating or detaining agency, its deputies will confiscate all deadly weapons in the possession or control of any patient detained for evaluation and treatment because they are a danger to themselves or others due to a mental disorder.

Officers from outside law enforcement agencies will follow their own agency policies and bear responsibility for confiscating and securing deadly weapons found on patients they bring to Los Angeles General Medical Center. Pursuant to California Welfare & Institutions section 8102 and Sheriff's Department Manual of Policy and Procedures sections 5-04/150.00 ("Property for Safekeeping") and 5-09/540.00 ("Tarasoff Notifications Received from Licensed Psychotherapists")."

Under state law, California generally disqualifies a person from purchasing, acquiring, or possessing firearms if a person is found to be a danger to self or others, or gravely disabled as a result of mental illness. The Augustus Hawkins Mental Health facility and Psychiatry Emergency Services (PES) at Los Angeles General Medical Center are required to submit a report to the California Department of Justice (DOJ) when requested (to determine a person's eligibility to possess a firearm).
