PURPOSE OF PROCEDURE:

To define the guidelines for completing the Intensive Care Unit patient care assignment.

POLICY STATEMENT:

The process for assigning nursing staff to provide patient care is based on the consideration of the following criteria:

- A. Patient Safety
- B. Patient Acuity: The complexity of the patient's condition and required nursing care.
- C. Staffing Ratios
 - 1. The nurse-to-patient ratio must be maintained at a maximum of 1:2 at all times. This includes breaks, in-service, code blue response, code assist, rapid response, sepsis etc.
 - 2. AB 394 guidelines will be followed.
- D. Experience and skill set of the nurse
 - 1. Nurses in ICU must have basic critical care training.
 - 2. Nurses are assigned to patient care based on clinical experience.
 - 3. Only nurses from PCU who have completed the DHS Core Critical Care Program may float to ICU.
 - 4. Float nurses will have an ICU nurse available as a resource.
- E. Continuity of care will be taken into consideration.
