SUBJECT: RED TAGGING OF MALFUNCTIONING EQUIPMENT

POLICY:

Properly identify hazardous or malfunctioning equipment to patients and employees.

PURPOSE:

It is uniformly agreed by all departments and Administration, that a red tag or a labeled red warning tag denotes a possible electrical hazard and the equipment will not be used until proper service can be performed by a Biomedical Technician or another facilities department.

PROCEDURE:

Red warning tags will be supplied to all department heads by the Biomedical Department. These tags will be used on malfunctioning equipment that pose a hazard to either patients or employees.

- 1. Each department head will be responsible for determining the immediate severity of the equipment problem and use their discretion on a red tag situation.
- 2. Once the malfunctioning equipment has been deemed unsafe and required a red warning tag, the equipment should be unplugged from its power source immediately.
- 3. After removing the equipment from its power source, the operator should then relocate the malfunctioning unit to a non-patient area.
- 4. Once the equipment has been removed, a red warning tag will be placed over the power switch or in a plainly visible area where it can be easily noticed.
- 5. After the above steps have been performed, a service request form must be filled out or a service call placed to facilities for repair.
