SUBJECT: 2014 FAMILY PLANNING - NON-COERCION POLICY

PURPOSE: To ensure that all employees and contract staff involved in the provision of

family planning services are aware of Federal law and High Desert Health

System (HDHS) policy regarding non-coercion for family planning

services.

POLICY: It is the policy of HDHS to ensure that all usage of family planning services

by any patient, participant, client, or customer be solely on a voluntary basis. Individuals must not be subject to coercion to receive services, or to use any particular method of family planning, or other clinic services.

All employees and contract staff involved in the provision of family planning services must be informed that they may be subject to prosecution under Federal Law, if they coerce or endeavor to coerce any patient, participant, client, or customer who presents for family planning services in a HDHS clinic to undergo an abortion or sterilization (Tubal Ligation, Vasectomy) procedure.

Coercion is defined as, "To force to act or think in a certain way – to compel, to dominate, restrain, or control forcibly; to bring about by force.

POLICY GUIDELINES:

All employees and contract staff involved in the provision of Family Planning services are required to sign an employee agreement which acknowledges reading and understanding this policy (see attached). New employees or contract staff will sign a copy of this policy as part of their orientation. All signed copies of the policy will be kept by the employee's supervisor in the employee's departmental file.
