SUBJECT: ABBREVIATIONS, ACRONYMS, AND SYMBOLS NOT TO

BE USED AT HIGH DESERT HEALTH SYSTEM

PURPOSE: To promote patient safety by decreasing miscommunication related

to patient care documentation.

POLICY: The organization has developed a standardized list of

abbreviations, acronyms and symbols not to be used in patient care

documentation. The following abbreviations, acronyms and symbols are considered dangerous and shall not be used when documenting in the medical record. In the event that a dangerous abbreviation, acronym, or symbol is used, it must be clarified by the prescribing provider or designee. The verification of the order must

be documented.

PROCEDURE:

The following dangerous abbreviations, acronyms, and symbols are not to be used in patient care documentation:

U	Write instead "Units"	
IU	Write instead "International Units"	
QD or qd	Write instead "once daily" or "q day"	
QOD	Write instead "every other day"	
MS	Write instead "morphine sulfate"	
MSO4	Write instead "morphine sulfate"	
MgSO4	Write instead "magnesium sulfate"	
Trailing zeros are not allowed	Write 20, not 20.0	
Leading zeros are required	Write 0.75, not .75
