    - Establishing mutual goals between patient-nurse and nurse-nurse
    - Active listening
    - Accepting constructive criticism
    - Empathy and understanding
    - Courtesy and consideration
- 2. Integrity: the conscious application of ethical principles at all times

## Demonstrated by:

- · Honesty and trustworthiness
- Respect of self and others
- Striving to understand the values of patients, families, and colleagues
- 3. Altruism: the inherent desire to help others through caring, compassion, and empathy while striving to protect the patient's health and well-being

- Unselfishness
- Non-judgmental
- Exceptional customer service
- Being devoid of expecting reward and/or recognition
- 4. Advocacy: the philosophy of nursing to support and protect the patient's health and well-being

## Demonstrated by:

- Open communication to achieve mutual goals
- Collaboration with the interdisciplinary team to ensure that the patient receives the necessary care to improve patient outcomes
- **5. Autonomy**: the application of nursing knowledge to facilitate independent decision making to improve patient outcomes Demonstrated by:
