Procedures/Services Provided	All ages: pediatric (excluding neonates), adolescent, adult and geriatric Occupational Therapy Occupational Therapy provides services to both inpatients and outpatients, services include (but not limited to): Assessment and training in occupational roles in the performance and engagement in meaningful activities of daily living in self-care; parenting; driving; pre-vocational and vocational and educational ; home and community skills; play and leisure, developmental and social skills. The assessment and treatment of neuromuscular, sensor-motor, cognitive and psychosocial components as they impact on function. Education of or consultation with the individual being served, family, or other caregivers. Recreation Therapy Recreation Therapy provides services to inpatients and outpatients. These services include (but are not limited to): Assessment of patient function related to leisure participation and quality of life. Provision of treatment to address leisure-related deficits and patient goals. Leisure education/counseling, re-socialization, community reintegration, creative expression, play and adapted training/education for leisure/sports.

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System to Determine Staffing Levels	OT Clinical Manger (OT Supervisor II) and Recreation Therapy Supervisor monitor programs to assure that the patient needs are continually reassessed and resultant service needs are defined so that the information related to the mix, numbers and expertise of staff needed is current. OT Clinical Manger (OT Supervisor II) and Recreation Therapy Supervisor monitor unit census and trends and collaborate to assure that imbalances are corrected and comparable levels of care are provided in all areas without interrupting consistency in the provision of patient care.		
	Staffing needs are reviewed at least monthly at the OT/RT Clinical Management Meeting, and are determined based on an analysis of patient volume, diagnosis and acuity, patient satisfaction, and performance improvement.
