SUBJECT/TITLE: SURGICAL SCRUB

**POLICY:** Persons participating in a sterile surgical procedure shall perform a surgical scrub.

**PURPOSE:** To remove soil and transient microbes from the skin. To reduce the number of

resident microbes on the skin. To inhibit the rebound growth of microbes.

**DEPARTMENTS:** Cardiology Angiography Suite

**DEFINITIONS:** To reduce contamination that may be transmitted from personnel to patient as well

as from patient to personnel.

**PROCEDURE:** 

## I. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS PRIOR TO SCRUB

- A. Persons with open lesions and breaks in their skin should <u>not</u> scrub for surgical procedures.
- B. Only persons in proper scrub attire shall scrub.
- C. Scrubbed persons are <u>not</u> permitted to wear jewelry on hands or arms
- D. Persons with artificial nails and/or nail polish are <u>not</u> permitted to scrub
- E. A pre-wash is required to the surgical scrub.

## II. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS DURING SCRUB

- A. Only broad spectrum, rapid acting, hospital-approved antimicrobial agents may be used for the surgical scrub.
- B. An anatomical timed scrub or a counted stroke method is acceptable.
  - 1. The surgical scrub should be performed for a minimum of five (5) minutes.
  - 2. All surfaces of the fingers, hands and arms to two inches above the elbow must be scrubbed.
- C. In cases of emergency, where time does not permit, scrub procedure and times may be modified.
