## SUBJECT/TITLE: INFECTION CONTROL FOR CONSTRUCTION SITES

**POLICY:** In accordance with hospital policy #900, to identify infection control risks, interventions, and control strategies that shall be considered in planning for construction and renovation in health care facilities.

**PURPOSE:** To prevent and control transmission of nosocmial infections during contraction and renovation activities.

**DEPARTMENTS:** FACILITIES

## **DEFINITIONS:**

**PROCEDURE:** 

- 1. Infection control shall be notified prior to any construction/renovation projects. The Infection Control nurse will review and approve plans for new construction or renovation project to ensure a safe environment.
  - 2. In the event of breech in Infection control precautions during construction, the incident will be reported to the assigned project manager and the construction related activity may be stopped
  - 3. Prior to the commencement of work, Facilities shall inform the Nurse Managers of all pending work.
  - 4. An Infection Control consultation form (attachment A) shall be completed by the Project Manager during the design phase and up-dated as necessary.
  - 5. A completed Infection control consultation form will be forwarded to Infection Control for review and approval, prior to any construction.
  - 6. Workers shall receive training on infection control practices and policies prior to starting any actual construction work.
  - 7. Infection control measures at the construction site shall be monitored weekly and more frequently, if necessary.
  - 8. The Project Manager shall arrange for terminal cleaning at the project's completion and prior to the final walk through and occupancy.
  - 9. A request may be submitted to Infection control to conduct a walk through upon completion of the project and prior to occupancy. The site shall be evaluated for integrity of building/equipment services, cleanliness and compliance with local and state codes and verification of special ventilation conditions, if any.

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
