SUBJECT/TITLE: TERMINATED PREGNANCIES

**POLICY:** Disposition of the terminated fetuses will follow the state guidelines.

**PURPOSE:** To ensure appropriate handling of terminated fetuses and ensure timely disposition.

**DEPARTMENTS:** All

**DEFINITIONS:** 

**PROCEDURE:** 

- 1. Fetuses 20 weeks or less and 400 grams or less are considered specimens and are handled by the Department of Pathology according to their policy and procedure.
- 2. Terminated fetuses that are 20 weeks or greater, or 400 grams or greater, that do not take a breath will be dispositioned as described below:
  - a. If the mother or the father wants the fetus for a service, social work will generate the "Verification of Pregnancy Termination" letter (see attached). The fetus will then be released to the mortuary.
  - b. If the mother or the father does not want the fetus, the physician will reputhe termination of pregnancy to the Coroner's office by completing the Coroner's Form #18. The fetus will then be released to the Coroner's office.
- 3. Terminated fetuses that take a breath regardless of weight or age need to be reported to the Coroner's office by the physician.
