SUBJECT/TITLE: FORENSIC STAFF ORIENTATION

**POLICY:** Los Angeles County Sheriff shall provide orientation and education to forensic

staff accompanying patients/prisoners to Olive View-UCLA Medical Center

(OVMC) for treatment.

**PURPOSE:** To ensure forensic staff accompanying patients/prisoners to OVMC receive

appropriate orientation and education regarding their responsibilities related to

patient care at the facility. These include:

How to interact with patient/prisoner;

Procedures for responding to unusual clinical events and incidents;

• The hospital's channels of clinical, security and administrative

communication; and

• The distinctions between forensic and medical/behavioral restraints.

**DEPARTMENTS:** All

**DEFINITIONS:** Forensic Staff are law enforcement personnel other than Los Angeles County

Sheriff Department personnel assigned to OVMC, who are responsible for transporting patients/prisoners to/from OVMC and guarding patients/prisoners

while at OVMC.

**PROCEDURE:** Forensic staff identifies himself/herself to security personnel located at every

entrance to OVMC.

Before entering OVMC, Security personnel will enter forensic staff information

into a log.

Once forensic staff personnel has been logged in, security personnel will provide each forensic staff person a brochure entitled, "Forensic Orientation for Law

Enforcement agencies Guarding or Transporting a Patient/Prisoner within a

ValleyCare Facility." (Attached)

It is incumbent upon the forensic staff person to read the brochure and familiarize

himself/herself with the content contained in the Orientation brochure

Any patient/prisoner under forensic staff protection or custody shall have care

coordinated to meet his/her clinical needs.

Forensic staff must consult with clinical staff before applying any restraints.

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Forensic staff shall ensure that patient rights are protected.

Forensic staff shall not leave the patient/prisoner without proper relief from the incustody agency or Sheriff.

Should an emergency arise that requires the forensic staff to leave the area, he/she shall immediately notify the Sheriff at Extension 3409.
