SUBJECT/TITLE: AGE SPECIFIC CARE AND TREATMENT

- **POLICY:** Assessment and Reassessment of patients with special needs based on age/population, will include information specific to the characteristics of the patients' age/population group.
- **PURPOSE:** To provide patient care that is individualized to the needs of the age/population group being served.
- **DEPARTMENTS:** All

DEFINITIONS: Age/population specific care incorporates the physical, motor, cognitive and psychosocial needs of the age related categories:

- \blacktriangleright Neonate: Birth 1 month
- ➢ Infant: 1 month -12 months
- \blacktriangleright Toddler: 1 4 years
- ➢ Pre-School: 4- 6 years
- \blacktriangleright Child -School Age: 6 12 years
- \blacktriangleright Adolescence: 13 18 years
- Adult: 19 64 years
- Adult-Geriatric: 65 years old + older

PROCEDURE: 1. All patient care providers use an assessment process that is specific to the patient's age, population and needs.

- 2. Patient care providers receive special training on age/population-specific assessment and care for age/population related categories.
- 3. Culturally Competent Age/Population –Specific Care and Development (Throughout the Life Span) Module is available on the Olive View-UCLA Intranet for clinical and non-clinical staff
- 4. Interventions universal to all age/population categories
 - Involve patient/significant other in procedures/care as appropriate.
 - Adapt care plan to patient's normal routine as much as possible
 - Allow for cultural diversity
 - Encourage patient/care giver to ask questions
 - Provide patient/family education based on how the person learns best.

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- Ensure that educational materials are language and reading level appropriate.
- Maintain safety at all times
- Facilitate patient /family in making individual choices and care decisions.
- Encourage expression of feelings and concerns.
- 5. Interventions and assessments are to be documented in the patients' electronic medical record and includes responses to interventions.
