SUBJECT/TITLE: DRUG SHORTAGES

POLICY: When drug shortages occur, the pharmacy service will coordinate the review of

medications and suitable alternative agents with the Department of Health

Services (DHS) Pharmacy.

PURPOSE: To provide guidelines in the event of drug shortages and provide suitable

therapeutic alternatives.

DEPARTMENTS: All

DEFINITIONS: A drug shortage is defined as insufficient supply, or potentially insufficient

supply, of a particular medication to meet the needs of the prescribers and/or

patients.

PROCEDURE: A. Anticipated Shortages

1. DHS Pharmacy reviews all anticipated shortages and summarizes all required information for communication with the staff. See DHS Communication Bulletin below for details.

B. Unanticipated Shortages

- 1. In the event of an unanticipated shortage with no notice, or if a shortage will affect supplies before the next Pharmacy and Therapeutics (P&T) Committee meeting, the Procurement Supervisor will contact DHS Pharmacy for supply information, recommended substitutions, and recommended conservation strategy.
- 2. The Director of Pharmacy, or designee, will contact the chairperson of the P&T Committee, review DHS recommendations, then forward information to Physician Service Chiefs for review.
- 3. An update is presented at the next P&T Committee.

C. DHS Communication Bulletin

1. DHS Pharmacy provides the "Drug Shortage Bulletin" to County

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pharmacies. The bulletin summarizes drug shortages and suitable alternative agents. The bulletin tracks anticipated and ongoing shortage issues.

- 2. The Pharmacy Chief, or designee, forwards the "Drug Shortage Bulletin" weekly to the facility Physician Service Chiefs, P&T Committee members and the pharmacists.
- 3. The Pharmacy Chief, or designee, will bring the therapeutic substitution review and related material to the next scheduled meeting of the P&T Committee.
- 4. A record of drug shortages and follow-up is included in the P&T Committee minutes. P&T members will forward or discuss shortage information and substitution options to their respective departments.
