SUBJECT/TITLE: HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

**POLICY:** The Olive View-UCLA Medical Center shall enforce and comply with the local

Fire Code and NFPA Life Safety Code for holiday decorations.

**PURPOSE:** To ensure a fire safe environment in all buildings during the holiday season.

**DEPARTMENTS:** ALL

**DEFINITIONS:** 

**PROCEDURE:** The following requirements are applicable to all buildings, places of assembly,

public lobbies, waiting areas, and other occupancies where the public is admitted

or invited at OVMC.

• Decorative materials, including artificial trees, are to be non-combustible, flame-resistant or treated with flame-retardant materials and have proof of a valid fire resistance certificate available at all times. All product information including the certificate, user guide, instructions, etc. should be kept and readily available at all times.

- Cut natural trees are prohibited from use.
- Artificial trees must have a valid fire resistance certificate issued for each tree.
- Decorative materials shall not be dry, brittle, or in a deteriorating state. It is strongly recommended not to use any decorative material that is over three years old.
- Decorative materials must not obstruct, conceal, or interfere with exits, doors, aisles, corridors, exit signs, exit lights, fire alarms, fire extinguishers, or any other fire-fighting equipment. A minimum clearance of three (3) feet shall be maintained at all times.
- Decorative materials are not to be installed in or on ceilings, fire sprinklers, doorways, egress corridors, fire exits, stairwells or elevators.

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- Gift wrapping of doors is not permitted.
- Open flame devices such as candles, lanterns, tiki torches etc. are prohibited from use.
- Electric lights are prohibited from use. In addition to posing a potential fire hazard, these lights can unnecessarily tax an already burdened electrical circuit.
- The use of battery-powered lights is permitted.
- Extension cords to power decorations are prohibited from use.
- Surge protectors are permitted for use; however, they are to be plugged directly into a wall outlet and never daisy chained together.
- Decorations shall be properly and safely stored at all times. In fire sprinklered areas, they must be stored at least 18 inches below the ceiling. In non-fire sprinklered, areas they must be stored at least 36 inches below the ceiling.
