SUBJECT/TITLE: INFECTION CONTROL PROCEDURES

- **POLICY:** To ensure that employees understand the importance of controlling the spread of infections throughout the facility.
- **PURPOSE:** To establish procedures for our Department so that employees perform their assigned duty with minimal danger to their personal health and/or physical safety.
- **DEPARTMENTS:** PATIENT ACCESS
- **DEFINITIONS:**

PROCEDURE: <u>EMPLOYEE:</u>

- 1. Follow personal hygiene procedures in all work and/or common areas.
 - A. Observe Hand washing procedures in Infection Control Manual. Attachment I
 - 1) Wash hands before and after using the bathroom.
 - 2) Wash hands before and after eating or drinking.
 - B. Use toilet seat liners when using the bathroom.
 - C. Use tissue to cover mouth when sneezing or coughing.
 - D. Wash fresh fruit and vegetables before cooking and eating.
 - E. Keep work areas and lunch areas clean and free of food products that attract rodents or other insects.
 - F. Keep food in sealed containers, whenever possible.
 - G. Food is to be kept in designated areas only.
 - H. Foam In and Out of patient centered areas.
- 2. Contact Environmental Services for major clean-up problems when they

- 3. Attend class in Infection Control as scheduled during Hospital Orientation.
- 4. Receive group training or individual counseling whenever a problem with an infectious disease occurs in the department.
- 5. Receive routine TBC testing from employee Health Services on a periodic basis based on location of job assignment.

<u>NOTE</u>: Employees who work directly with patients are required to receive TBC testing annually.

6. Observe Universal Blood and Body Fluid Precautions.

SUPERVISOR:

- 1. Ensure employees observe safety precautions in order to prevent the spread of infections.
- 2. Ensure employees receive periodic TBC testing as mandated.
- 3. Ensure employees receive appropriate infection control training to prevent occupational exposure
