SUBJECT/TITLE: SPUTUM INDUCTION

POLICY: The method of sputum induction, when not specified by the physician is left to the

discretion of the therapist. All routine sputum inductions shall be immediately labeled with a bar code and transported to specific drop off areas or laboratory.

PURPOSE: To obtain bronco-pulmonary secretions for laboratory analysis.

DEPARTMENTS: RESPIRATORY CARE SERVICES

EQUIPMENT: 1. Patient Labels

2. Computer generated bar codes

3. Sputum specimen container

4. Induction solution, 10% hypertonic saline solution as indicated

5. Aerosol delivery device (HHN)

NOTE Upon physician's request mucolytic (e.g. acetylcysteine) may be used.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. Verify physician's order
- 2. Don appropriate personal protective equipment (Gown, gloves, masks, PAPR, etc)
- 3. Introduce yourself and identify patient using at least two patient identifiers (Pt name, OV number, birthdate, etc.)
- 4. Explain procedure to patient
- 5. Prepare HHN with hypertonic saline 10% solution as indicated
- 6. Deliver hypertonic solution, instruct patient to breathe through mouth slowly and deeply with an inspiratory pause as indicated.
- 7. Coach patient to cough and expectorate into specimen container. Please note that this process has to be directly witnessed.

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- 8. Obtain specimen
- 9. Label the specimen with patient name, date and time.
- 10. Have patient verify that all of the information of the labels is correct.
- 11. Obtain and attach the computer generated bar code make sure to time, date and sign it according to the Pathology Policy on Specimen Labeling Requirement (#2075 v 2).
- 12. Deliver to specific drop off area or laboratory
- 13. Chart character of sputum, how it is obtained (induced with hypertonic solution or fresh), time and date of induction.
- 14. If induction was unsuccessful, chart such.
