SUBJECT: HAZARDOUS MATERIALS/WASTE MANAGEMENT

POLICY NO. 915

PURPOSE::

To ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations governing the ordering, generation, use, storage, recycling or disposal of hazardous materials/waste in DHS facilities.

POLICY::

Each facility/program administrator shall develop and implement a program for complying with applicable laws and regulations affecting the ordering, generation, use, storage, recycling or disposal of hazardous materials/waste.

GUIDE::

Each facility/program adminstrator shall:

- 1. Develop written procedures for managing hazardous materials/waste from "cradle to grave."
- 2. Develop written procedures for assuring compliance with applicable regulations governing the ordering, generation, use, storage, recycling or disposal of hazardous materials/waste.
- 3. Establish provisions to safeguard patients, visitors and employees from hazardous materials/waste found through inspedtions or accidental exposure.
- 4. Schedule periodic inspections to identify and correct hazardous materials/waste problems that may be found in DHS buildings.
- 5. Document corrections and follow-up actions and distribute reports to the appropriate personnel.
- 6. Ensure that inspections are conducted by trained personnel with the knowledge or work operations, processes and related materials to recognize hazards and recommend proper corrective action.
- 7. Develop response mesures to citations or other notices from governmental agencies or regulatory bodies.
- 8. Ensure that all plans of correction are consistent with federal, state and local regulations.
- 9. Maintain current reference documents and publications related to safely managing hazardous materials/waste including federal, state and local hazardous materials-related regulations.
