PURPOSE

To ensure that the patient's fundamental right to control the decisions regarding his or her own health care is recognized and respected; and to ensure that an appropriate surrogate makes decisions in accordance with the patient's wishes and/or best interests when the patient is unable to do so, or at the patient's request.

POLICY

The rights of patients and/or their surrogate decision-makers to control the decisions relating to the patient's own health care shall be respected in all areas, including development of care plans and delivery of service(s).

PROCEDURE

Minimally, the Medical Center shall develop and implement policies, guidelines, and procedures that address:

- Patient/surrogate decision-making regarding treatment, care, and service.
- When necessary, using an appropriate surrogate to make decisions on behalf of the patient in regard to all aspects of care or treatment decisions.
- Resolving conflict in care or treatment decisions.
- Forgoing resuscitation or other life-sustaining treatment; addressing when it is appropriate to initiate resuscitative services or use or remove life-sustaining treatment; and identifying individuals to be involved in such decision-making.
- Conducting investigational studies or clinical trials.
- The Senior Executive Council is charged to ensure the Medical Center facilities, departments, services, functions, and areas develop and implement policies, guidelines, and procedures that conform to applicable Medical Center policies, and all legal and regulatory requirements.
